I

Every city has a “spirit”, dominate characteristic and presence.

Consider *Colossians 1:14-16*

- Everything He created was good however they were corrupted. “Thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers” Paul uses to describe the forces of evil throughout the universe.

II

Consider what these words actually mean.

Throne—The throne is simply the institution of power in a state, city, or economic body.

Dominion—A dominion is the territory influenced or ruled by the throne; it is the sphere of formal influence of that structure of power.

Principality—The principality or prince is the specific person who currently occupies the throne.

Power—The power of a throne comprises the rules, legalities, traditions, and sanctions that legitimize the throne’s rule over that dominion.

III

The church has believed for centuries that the principalities and powers are solely spiritual forces.

The church believes that they have their abode and authority in the “heavenlies only.”

Such forces may be celestial or terrestrial, earthly and heavenly.

Consider *Psalm 8, 1Peter 3:22 and Psalm 103:12-22*

Mankind is impacted by celestial and terrestrial realms.

Mankind can make impact to celestial and terrestrial realms.

Consider *Ephesians 2:1-10*

But the principalities and powers are the spiritual forces that work through the structures and systems of a city, nation or universe.

Grace is God doing for us what we could not do for ourselves.

Grace is God’s activity working around us, in us and through us.

Grace is a gift given and granted by God.

Grace is His guarantee to start and complete the work.
