Psalms 4

A Psalm of David

-David was a royal preacher

-His psalms are devotional, practical and doctrinal

-Doctrine: principles, systems of teachings, and/or religious policies

This Psalm designed to be Expostulatory or Doctrinal

-To reason with someone earnestly against something that person intends to do or had done

-Remonstrate: to say or plead in protest or objection or disapproval

-To present reasons in complaints; to plead in protest of

Designed for general instruction, not for or in response to any specific event/occasion

-Written to assist their devotions -To direct their conversations

Prayer to God (v. 1)

- Acknowledging God as the One Who justifies him
- Trusting God to help him to say the right thing

Addresses Mankind (v. 2-6)

- Reproves (gently)
 - Criticizes or corrects their behavior
- Exhorts (encourage)
 - Gently admonishes
 - o Advises them to trust and serve God

The Positive Results of Trusting and Honoring God (v. 7-8)

• The result of trust is rest
